Issue for discussion: Considering the application of Grigorii Semenchuk within the Events Participation Support Scheme

For the consideration of the Committee of Translations the application of the cultural manager Grygorii Semenchuk for the participation in the Bratislava Book Festival BRAK (Slovakia) and business meetings with the Krakow Festival Office (Poland) was submitted. The expected funding equals 590 Euro and covers travel and staying expenses.

Primary analysis of the application by the local team of the project has shown that it meets the formal requirements -it is correctly filled and contains all necessary supporting documents.


While considering the application of Grigorii Semenchuk the procedure of conflict of interests was maintained. As the applicant is simultaneously the Committee member, he did not participate in the decision-making process concerning his own application.

The application of Grygorii Semenchuk did not raise any questions of the Committee members. Ms. Antonenko emphasized that it was necessary to support such business trips aimed at the maintenance of business contacts and the development of cooperation. By his previous activity the applicant has showed himself as the one who can successfully negotiate at the appropriate level and reach agreement on further cooperation. Ms. Alla Tatarenko also mentioned that the application was worth supporting as it was prepared by the active participant of the literary process in Ukraine, who by his activity contributes to establishing and strengthening cultural contacts with other countries. The Committee member Nataliia Ivanychuk also decided in favor of the application and recommended to fully support the application. She believes in a successful achievement of the aims of the trip, as she is familiar well enough with the professional activity of the applicant.

In such a way the decision to support the application of Grygorii Semenchuk and to provide funding equaling 590 Euro to cover travel (350 Euro) and staying expenses and per diems (240 Euro) was made.

The participant commits himself to provide a lengthy report on the results of the trip and also to share the gained experience with his colleagues by means of meetings, presentations and/or publications. All presentations and publications, made within and as a result of these professional trips, should contain a reference that the trip was supported by the Book Platform project, funded by Eastern Partnership Culture Programme of the EU.
